ENGINEER'S REPORT: The Township Solicitor and Township Engineer discussed Hawkins Road and the speed limit. The Solicitor had a discussion with a resident who requested the speed limit be increased from 25 to 50 mph. It was further discussed the road was paved with DOT and Pinelands guidelines which the Township had to abide by. Funding for paving came from the developer, Lenape and DOT. The Township Engineer stated due to the curves in the road, fatalities, wetlands and the ditches along the road the right to establish, the recommended speed limit was established at 25 mph.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:

Mayor Young opened the meeting to the public.

Roger Decillia, 2 Thames Court, discussed his concerns about the speeding in Leisuretown and the most recent accident in front of his home on the curve. Mr. Decillia asked about speed humps. The Township Engineer discussed the pros and cons of speed humps. Mayor Young stated the State Police would be contacted. An article about speeding could be placed in the Trustees Corner and Watchdog informing residents of the speed limit.

Don Hetzel, 2 Wooton Drive, discussed the report on Safe Streets he submitted to the Township Administrator on speeding and the solar speed signs.

Committeewoman Rossell stated the residents don't stop at the stop signs in Leisuretown either.

No one from the public wishing to be heard the public portion was closed.


