
Date: Tuesday, August 11, 2015

See the stars in a portable planetarium which will be set up in the Old Town Hall. Learn where the constellations are located and then learn about the Perseid's Meteor Shower which is occurring from August 11 to August 14.



The Perseid's meteor shower, which is one of the brighter meteor showers of the year, occurs every August, peaking around August 9-13. The meteor shower is made of tiny space debris from the comet Swift-Tuttle. The Perseids are named after the constellation, Perseus. This is

because the radiant or the direction from which the shower seems to come in the sky lies in the same direction as Perseus. The constellation can be found in the north-eastern part of the sky.
