

SOUTHAMPTON TOWNSHIP
BUDGET WORKSHOP
April 7, 2016 at 3:00 p.m.

This 2016 budget workshop meeting of the Southampton Township Committee was held on April 7, 2016 at the Robert L. Thompson Building, 5 Retreat Road, Southampton, New Jersey. The meeting was called to order by Mayor James F. Young, Sr., at 3:00 p.m. and followed by a salute to the Flag of the United States of America.

A roll call confirmed those Committee members who were present, which included: Committeeman Ronald Heston, Committeeman Raftery, Committeewoman Rossell, Deputy Mayor Tiver and Mayor James F. Young, Sr.

2016 MUNICIPAL BUDGET WORKSHOP

The Township Committee discussed the five (5) year capital budget projections and the 2016 capital budget projects. Discussions focused on the current 2016 capital budget and the 2017 capital budget projects that included road improvements and equipment for the public works department, the revenue the Township receives from the Good Farm lease agreement and the Good Farm improvements for recreation. Additional discussion took place about different ways to reduce costs such as comparison of in house trash collection and contracting with a private hauler. The Committee requested information for estimated in house trash collection cost.

Further discussion took place for the Vincentown sewer utility system budget for 2016.
